

e-Learning for Kids Announces New Energy Conservation Course: The Responsible Use of Energy

The course uses hands-on activities to teach kids the types of energy sources available worldwide, how to create a sustainable and responsible energy mix regionally, and how to conserve energy in their day-to-day lives. After completing the course, children earn an Energy Ambassador certificate.
